


Public Health Radon Reduction Roadmap

Recommended Practices and Policies to Reduce Exposure to Radon in our Communities



Tier 1: Outreach & Education

For communities with little or no awareness of radon risks.

Option	Venue or Method	Example
Provide low-cost radon tests kits or coupons coupled with educational materials. These cost-effective tests provide valuable information, especially when paired with follow-up assistance to understand and take action on results. Require that each contract for the sale of residential property contain prescribed language warning of radon hazards, requiring seller disclosure of known concentrations, and urging testing. As an incentive, discount new home permits if radon-resistant new construction (RRNC) techniques are incorporated into the home during construction. This is known as the "Radon Rebate" program. Create an incentive program that gives the designation of "Gold Standard Radon-Resistant Builder" to builders who routinely install active radon mitigation (reduction) systems. Create an incentive program that gives the designation of "Radon Aware" to real estate professionals who receive radon training and who pledge to be "Radon Aware" by agreeing to provide up-to-date radon educational materials and always recommending certified radon contractors to their clients. Tier 3: Institutional Change & Policy

For communities ready to incorporate policies and practices that directly reduce radon exposure into city/county codes, programs, and practices.

Options	Venue or Method	Example
Require owners of rental units to inform renters, in writing, before a lease is signed if the rental space has been tested for radon and that a radon hazard may exist. If the rental unit hasn't been tested, require that the renter can conduct a do-it-yourself radon test or ask the owner to test by hiring a licensed radon contractor. If a renter conducts a radon test in the rental unit and results show high radon levels, require the renter to inform the building owner, in writing. Require radon testing in all residential rental properties, and unless a mitigation (reduction) system is installed, allow tenants to request a retest every 10 years. If the radon level is 4 pCi or higher and is not mitigated, allow the landlord or tenant to end the lease with at least 30 days' notice. Require all multifamily building projects receiving government funding meet radon testing and mitigation (reduction) requirements for new construction, Substantial Rehab, Moderate Rehab, and Projects with Underground Garages (no other ground contact space). Require that work performed by a radon mitigation (reduction) system contractor includes the layout, fabrication, and installation of a radon mitigation system. Require work involving heat recovery ventilation or makeup air components to be performed by a heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) contractor and not include electrical wiring (which must be performed by an electrical contractor). Tier 4: Inspection and Enforcement

For communities ready to compel stakeholders to provide radon-resistant housing and require radon mitigation in existing homes be installed by certified contractors.

Options	Method	Example
Require all new construction of single-family homes, multi-family homes, and other specified residential buildings be built using Radon Reduction New Construction (RRNC) techniques. Enforce Radon Resistant New Construction (RRNC) code regulations, including plan review and inspection by building and electrical subcode officials.
